Dear Residents and Employees,

There are currently no cases of COVID-19 in any resident throughout our community. There are two Waverly Care employees who are in quarantine after having tested positive. Both individuals are doing well and will be finished quarantine by this Monday.

The Montgomery County 14-day positivity rate as of Sunday, May 2nd decreased to 6.35%. We are hopeful that rate will go below 5%, which will allow us to begin reducing current restrictions even further. The Main Line Health system COVID-19 related admissions to their four hospitals and one acute rehabilitation center are now down to 81 as of this past Tuesday.

The percentage of vaccinated employees is consistent at 79% for Waverly Heights and 86% for Waverly Care. We continue to test non-vaccinated employees on a weekly basis to ensure quick identification of any positive cases. The percentage of vaccinated residents remains 99.5% with one Independent Living and one Personal Care resident choosing not to receive the vaccine.

Our goal is to reopen the Independent Living areas, including our restaurants, to visitors and guests on May 31st. This effort will be dependent on the positivity rate in Montgomery County being below 5%. After consultation with Dr. Breish and our Infection Control Team, we are confident based on current trends and vaccination rates that this milestone will be achieved in the coming weeks. While the Health Care Center must follow the guidelines established by the Department of Health and the Department of Human Services, we are hopeful that residents of the Health Care Center will be welcomed back into the residential living areas of our community as of May 31st.

We hope everyone enjoyed this week's video where we highlighted the incredible Bates Family Theatre here at Waverly Heights. It's truly a magnificent venue that brings great joy and happiness to our residents and employees.

It is with sincere gratitude and appreciation that we thank our residents on behalf of our employees for the time, energy and thoughtfulness that went into this past Tuesday's staff appreciation event in the Auditorium. The fact that residents took their time to individually recognize each and every staff member demonstrates how much we mutually care for each other at our community. We are proud of the contributions from both staff and residents in making Waverly Heights an amazing place to work and to live!
